Homemaker Services Program - 2025 Relaunch

The Native Village of Nuiqsut is relaunching the Homemaker Services Program to provide direct support to Elders in their homes. This program helps Elders live safely and independently by offering help with light household chores, errands, wellness check-ins, and companionship.

We are now hiring for Homemaker I positions, which are part-time and flexible. Even a few hours a week can make a meaningful difference. A Lead Homemaker position is also open to help with coordination and support.

Paid Training for Homemakers

All Homemakers will receive paid training after hire. Training includes:

- Orientation
- CPR certification
- State-required training on reporting harm to vulnerable adults

Homemakers are considered mandatory reporters under Alaska law when working with Elders. This means they are required to report suspected abuse or neglect, just like VPSOs, teachers, and health professionals.

Traditional Hunter Support

Hunters who provide traditional foods to elders can receive a \$500 stipend per hunt. No training is required. Hunters simply need to complete an application and pick up the Hunter Guidelines at the Tribal Office.
